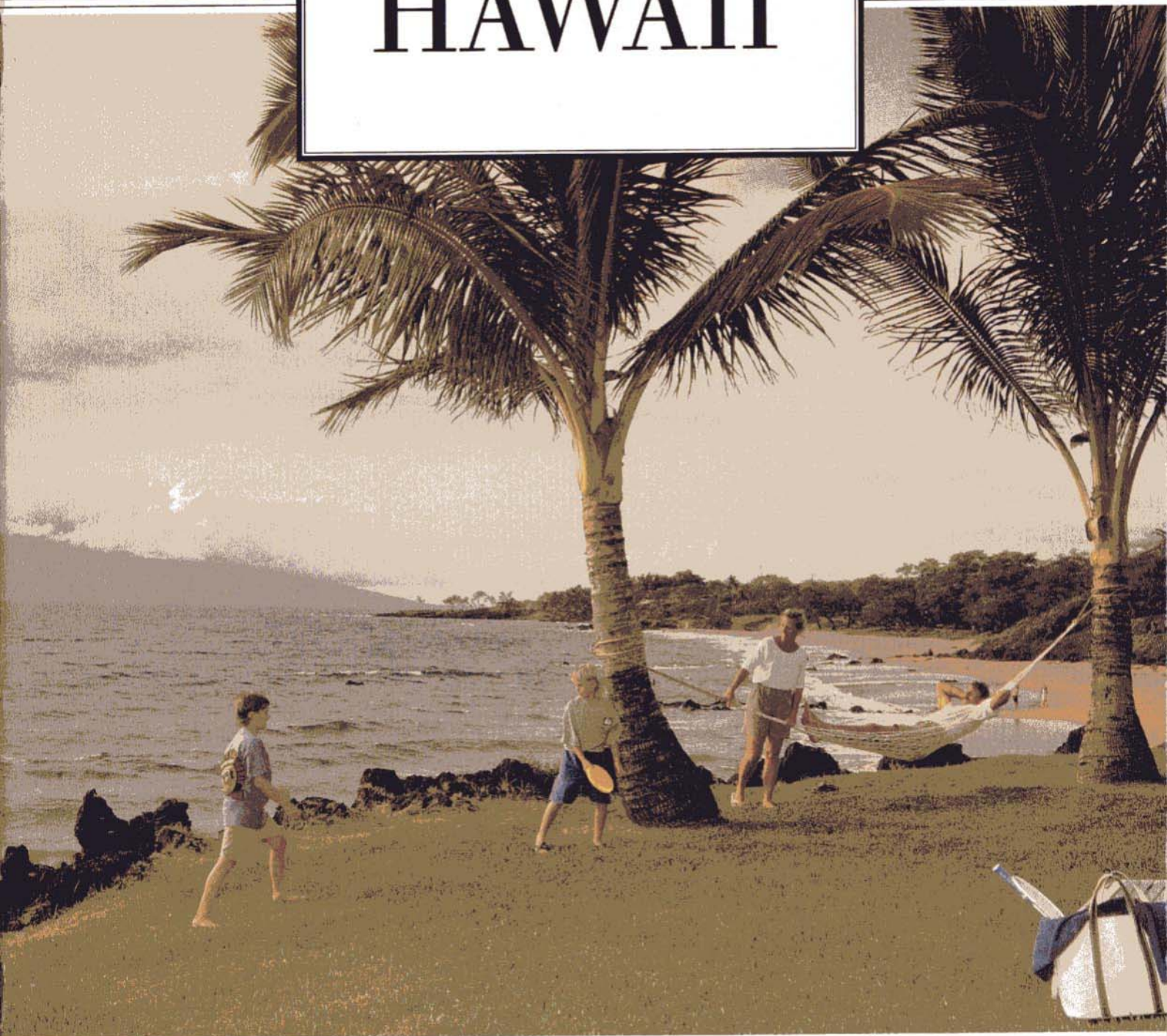

THE natural scenery of Kauai has no equal among these islands. From the rain-drenched peak of Mt. Waialeale to the very edges of the island, foliage and vegetation flourish here in an emerald celebration of the Earth. This flora ranks right alongside Tahiti and the Far Pacific Islands in terms of spectacular natural beauty—yet the Island of Kauai is so much closer to home! Waimea Canyon, called “The Grand Canyon of the Pacific,” testifies to the grandeur of the eternal battle between stone and the elements, sporting a rainbow assortment of spectacular gorges and caverns. As the oldest island of the Hawaiian chain, Kauai has had the most time to develop and perfect its beaches, with magnificent stretches of ivory sand embracing the majority of its circumference.

Upon these shores did Captain James Cook first set foot on what he named “The Sandwich Islands.” Here did Kaumualii thwart the impending invasion of King Kamehameha III through diplomacy, thus making Kauai the only Hawaiian Island untouched by the latter’s conquests.

Kauai is a feast for the senses. Feel the ebb tide surging around your ankles, entrenching your feet yet deeper into the fine-grained sand. Share the laughter of your enraptured children, even as the tradewinds sing the chants of ancient Hawaiian kings.
